Dear Prospective Supervisory Student:


Thank you for inquiring about serving as a Supervisory Student in our Teacher Certification Program (TCP). During their third and final year at ACAT, our trainees work with these students under the supervision of a senior member of our faculty. As the trainees progress through the program, they are required to work with supervisory students with ever-decreasing levels of experience in the Alexander Technique, until by their final term they are working with students who have never had a lesson. Please consult the chart at the bottom of this page for our upcoming needs.

The primary focus of the TCP is, of course, our trainees, and our Supervisory Student program is geared towards their educational needs. The supervisory students benefit also, however; you will have ample opportunity to experience hands-on Alexander Technique instruction and to learn about our TCP, should you have an interest in training. If you are selected for our program, you will be invited to participate in one of two ways:

- During classes of the TCP. You will come to the school once a week for 45 minutes for eight consecutive weeks. Depending on the class, you may work with one or more trainees during a session. You are expected to commit to all eight sessions and to contact a designated student coordinator at least 24 hours in advance of any absence. The fee for serving as a Supervisory Student in classes is \$80 per term.
- In individual supervised or non-supervised sessions. You will receive private instruction from a trainee in a series of lessons, to be scheduled according to the availability of you, the trainee, and the supervising teacher if applicable. To serve as a student in these individual supervised lessons, the lesson fees range from free to \$25/lesson, PLUS the cost of any rent for use of a teaching studio.

If you wish to be considered for participation in the Supervisory Student Program, please complete the Supervisory Student Application and return it by mail or fax (212-633-2239). When you are selected, you will be asked to sign a contract and to remit the fees as listed above. Please be aware that we have limited slots and may not always be able to use everyone who applies for a given term. We will keep every applicant's name on file, however, for future terms.
